This is because seghosen is uniquely made for a special occasion like wedding ceremonies, chieftaincies, kingship installation e.t.c. the wearer of the seghosen costume is usually a wealthy or highly placed individual; a lot of respect is accorded him because the textile is considered beyond the reach of common man. The aim of restriction and taboos placed around the production of Sehghosen is to ensure the quality of the fabric meets the high standard it is accorded.

In modern times, Youths have largely been allowed to be involved in the production process as times and processes have evolved. Older women who are weavers of seghosen today took years of diligent practice to master the painstaking weaving process of the seghosen.

2.3 Seghosen costume section

In recent times seghosen has evolved into a modern exportable commodity used to make fashion accessories such as bags, bags, shoes and even make up kits
